**PSW and LUMS Build Future-Ready Customs Workforce Through Trade Diploma Program**

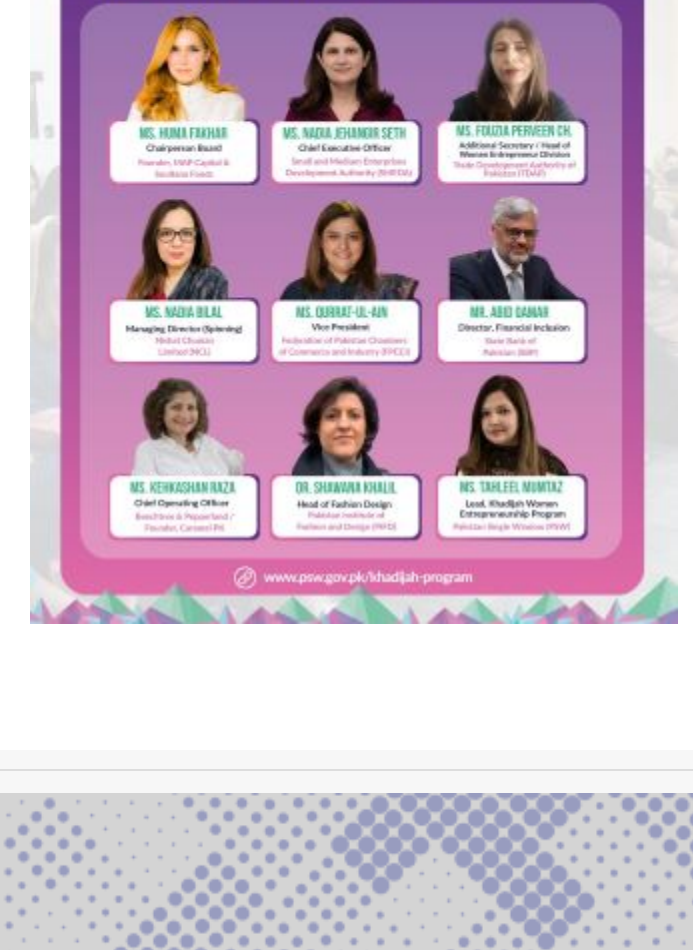

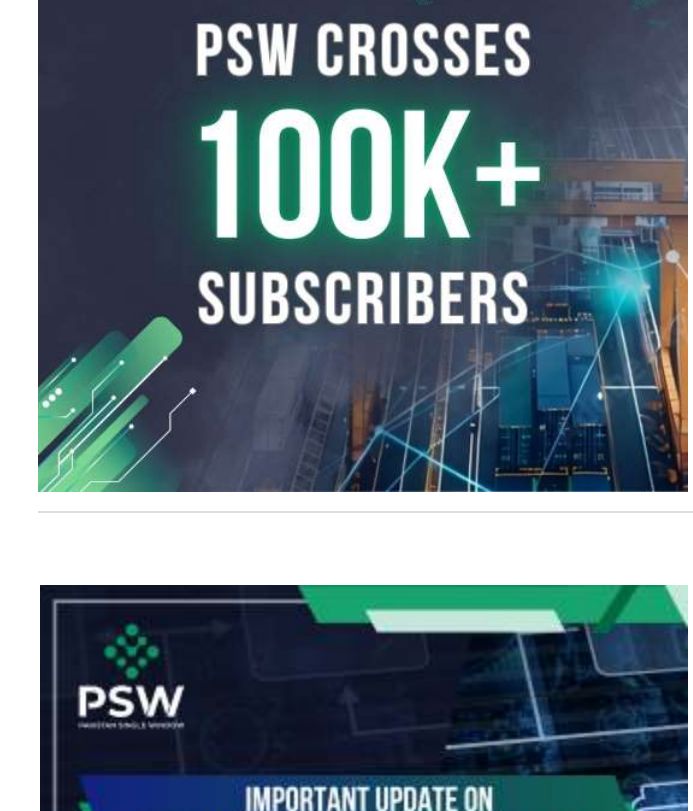

**QICT Transitions to Fully Online Delivery Order Processing System via PortVerse**

Operations at Qasim International Container Terminal (QICT), Port Qasim are moving toward a fully digitalized framework with the introduction of an online Delivery Order system through the Port Community System (PCS) - PortVerse. This shift replaces traditional manual processes with an integrated digital workflow, enabling more efficient coordination among all stakeholders. From April 21, 2026, all delivery order processing will be carried out exclusively through PCS by traders, customs agents, and shipping representatives, improving speed, transparency, and overall operational efficiency across the port ecosystem.

**PSW Facilitates First Export to Kyrgyzstan via New TIR Land Corridor Through Sost**

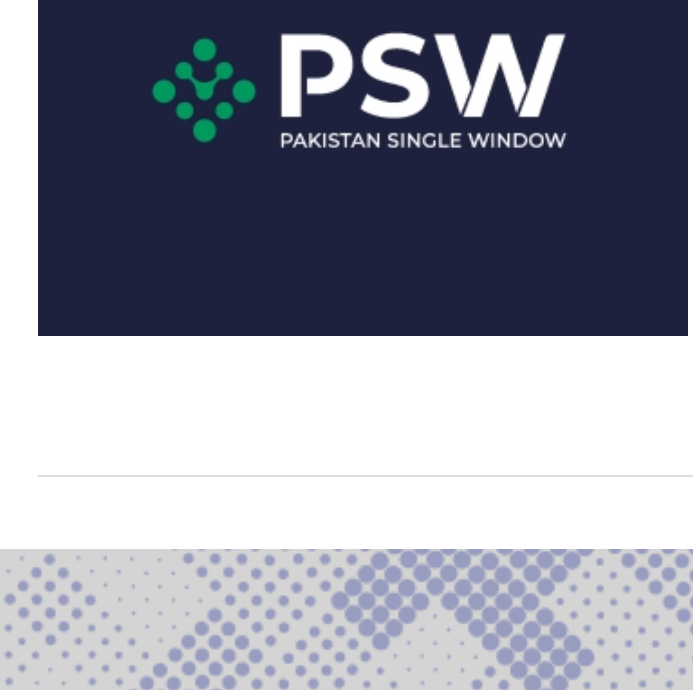

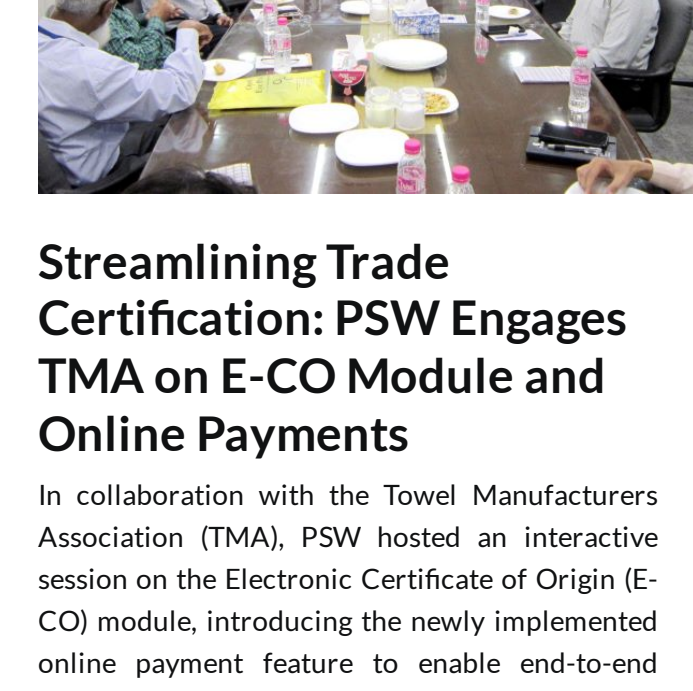

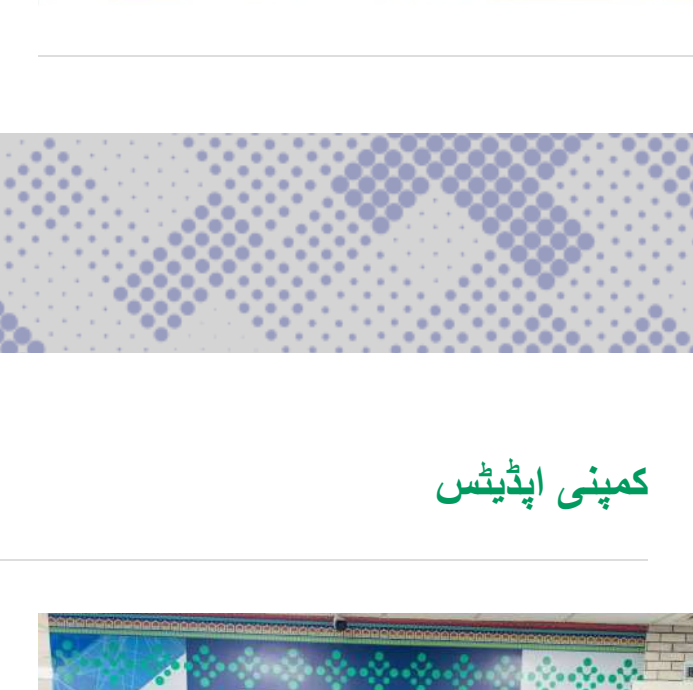
