KARACHI – Pakistan Single Window (PSW), under its SMElevate initiative, organized a full-day capacity building workshop in Karachi to empower textile small and medium enterprises (SMEs) for global trade. The workshop enabled SMEs to leverage digitization and PSW's digital cross-border trade facilitation services to strengthen export readiness and compete internationally. This pioneering e-learning platform marks a significant step in equipping SMEs, including women led businesses, with the knowledge and tools they need not only to expand globally but also to achieve sustainable success in international markets.
